

6 Steps for Preventing Adult Sexual Misconduct & Child Sexual Abuse



Summary & Discussion Guide: Module 4 –On-Site Behavioral Boundaries-Elementary School (Part 1)

Our intention is to intercede **BEFORE** abuse happens rather than just report after the fact. Suggested Boundaries not only protect youth from potential abusers, they also protect educators and classified staff from being falsely accused.

Ban unprofessional behavior. Unprofessional behavior includes: (Source 1, 2, 3, 4, 5)

- Off-color comments
- Being flirtatious
- Snapping bra straps or underwear
- Giving preferential treatment to a specific child
- Compliments about clothing, hair or make-up

Establish a no intimidations – no manipulation policy. (Source 1, 6, 7, 8)

- Variety of tactics used by child molesters to keep children silent
 - o Threats of punishment
 - o Manipulate child with gifts
 - o Threaten to HURT family member, family pet or abuse their sibling

Physical touch to absolute minimum; off limits kinds of touch include: (Source 1, 9, 10)

- Kissing even on the cheek, massage
- Stroking of hair or any other part of the body
- Front-to-front or front-to-back hugs, USE side hugs, high fives or fist bumps
- Sitting on laps, physical horseplay, piggy back rides or tickle games
- Assisted instruction that includes body-to-body touching such as batting or musical instruments

These limits on physical touching go in both directions – staff touching children or children touching staff. (Source 1,9, 10)

Limit medical exams and treatment. (Source 1)

- Staff members to treat minor injuries
- Dispensing of approved and properly packaged medications with a least two adults present
- Treatment of injuries and dispensing of medications should be done in openly observable area by other adults
- More involved medical procedures should be handled by outside medical professionals
- Special education student's medical treatment should be in accordance with IEP
